April 12, 2026 - Sunday

Traveling to Brussels, Belgium
Our beautiful adventure begins as we take an overnight flight to Brussels. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you embark on the trip of a lifetime.

April 13, 2026 - Monday

Welcome to Belgium! Upon arrival, we will meet our private tour guide and take a brief drive to the heart of Brussels for a panoramic sightseeing tour. Brussels is the capital of Europe and home to several international institutions, including NATO and the European Commission. We will drive through the European district, pass by the European Parliament, and visit the Atomium. This towering monument, standing at 335 feet, is one of the tallest structures in Belgium. Its nine 59-foot stainless steel spheres are connected in the shape of a unit cell that could represent an iron crystal magnified 165 billion times. It offers stunning views and serves as the emblem of Brussels. A delightful welcome lunch is served at a centrally located restaurant before we enjoy a short city walk, which includes a visit to a local chocolaterie. Experience a chocolate-making demonstration and, of course, chocolate tasting! We will conclude our day in picturesque Bruges and check in to our hotel for a relaxing evening. April 14, 2026 - Tuesday

Bruges
After breakfast, we are ready to step back in time and explore Bruges on foot. With its beautiful medieval architecture, cobblestone streets and picturesque canals, it seems straight out of a fairy tale. Often called the "Venice of the North," it beckons its visitors to tour its grand squares as well as its tiny back alleys,

and discover all its lovely charms. We will take a boat trip on the canals and visit the Lace Centre Museum. By the 13th Century, Bruges was the epicenter of Europe's textile trade. The large volume of textiles moving into and out of the area developed a rich fashion industry, which paved the way for Bruges' unique lace industry. You will have the opportunity to watch a bobbin lace-making demonstration. The remainder of the afternoon is free for shopping, more sightseeing, or simply "people-watching" and enjoying life. We will gather for dinner at a beautiful local restaurant. B | D

April 15, 2026 - Wednesday

Ghent - Antwerp
After a hearty breakfast, we will depart for Ooidonk Castle. Close your eyes and take a journey back in time. The exceptionally well-kept 17th-century castle's exterior is a wonderful example of the Renaissance style, complete with a beautiful French garden. The interior is a story in itself; wait and see! Just a few minutes' drive, and we will arrive in Ghent, where lunch is served before we embark on an afternoon city walk. We will visit St. Bavo Cathedral, including the Mystic Lamb augmented reality experience. With special glasses, we will travel back to the distant past in the cathedral's crypt and witness the tumultuous history of the Ghent Altarpiece and the cathedral as if we were right there. The masterpiece and the imposing building are brought to life down to the smallest detail. Before we depart for Antwerp, we will stop by a traditional waffle bakery to delight in heavenly mouthfuls of sweet, crisp waffles. Yum! We will arrive in Belgium's largest city in the afternoon. Antwerp has been known as the world's diamond capital for several centuries, a title that hasn't been easily earned.

The diamond trade in the port began nearly 500 years ago when the first rough stones were brought over from India. The city also hosts one of the biggest ports in the world and is famous for its legacy of fine arts. Enjoy medieval streets, Renaissance monuments, and a vibrant city by night. Cycling is a popular choice for getting around this stylish Flemish city. Is anyone up for a ride? B | L

April 16, 2026 - Thursday

Antwerp
After a delicious breakfast, we will take a city walk, which will certainly include a visit to the Diamond and Jewelry Museum. We will explore the journey of a diamond from raw material to sparkling gem. In addition to the diamonds, the museum also boasts a stunning collection of silverware. Enjoy lunch at your leisure before we continue with a visit to the Red Star Line Museum. The Red Star Line was the steamship line established in 1872 by Clement Acton Griscom, a Philadelphia Quaker. It was a joint venture that also operated the American Line. Two million passengers migrated to America on Red Star Line ships; one of them was Irving Berlin, who crossed the ocean to pursue his dream in 1893. This evening, tonight is among the locals at dinner a traditional and centrally located restaurant. B | D

April 17, 2026 - Friday

Kinderdijk - Rotterdam - The Hague
After breakfast, we will enter the Netherlands. Our first stop is to marvel at the world-famous Kinderdijk (Children) Windmills, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The story behind the name Kinderdijk comes from a legendary tale of a flood in 1421. As the floodwaters receded, survivors discovered a floating cradle with a cat

balancing on the edges and a happy baby nestled inside. From then on, the location was referred to as the “Child’s Dike.” Nearly all the mills are inhabited by at least one person holding a miller’s degree. They are authorized to operate these impressive machines for actual milling. Next, we will drive to Rotterdam to explore this beautiful city on foot. We will also stop for traditional Dutch coffee and apple cake, and take a boat tour through the harbor. In the afternoon, we will reach The Hague, located on the North Sea coast. Dinner will be served at our hotel tonight. B | T | D

April 18, 2026 - Saturday

The Hague - Delft

This morning, we will take a half-day tour of The Hague, known as the international city of peace and justice. For more than a century, it has been a gathering place for countries at peace conferences and international courts to promote peace through justice rather than through war and conflict. The Hague is perhaps best known for its beaches, monuments, and bustling shopping district, but this city has much more to offer. You will discover a wide variety of museums and a plethora of welcoming restaurants. Enjoy excellent people-watching, as over 180 different nationalities reside in The Hague. We will visit the Mauritshuis Museum, home to some of the finest Dutch paintings from the era of Rembrandt and Vermeer. Admire the masterpiece “Girl with a Pearl Earring,” often referred to as the “Mona Lisa of the Low Countries.” A visit to the Netherlands would be incomplete without exploring the beautiful Royal Delft porcelain. We will head to the picturesque city of Delft, a canal-ringed city known as the manufacturing hub for Delftware, hand-painted blue-and-white pottery. You will have the chance to decorate your own

April 19, 2026 - Sunday

Amsterdam

Breakfast is served, and a short 50-minute drive takes us to Amsterdam, the capital of the Netherlands. With over 800 years of history waiting to be discovered, Amsterdam is rich in fascinating attractions and sights. From old castles to beautiful museums and charming secret courtyards to picturesque cobbled streets, this capital city is a feast for the eyes, and it’s no wonder it has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We will enjoy a day in the company of Van Gogh and Anne Frank, followed by a wine and cheese canal cruise in the evening. You will have time for shopping and to enjoy an abundance of boutique-style cafes. The Van Gogh Museum houses the world’s largest collection of works by the maestro himself. With over 200 paintings, 500 drawings, and 700 letters, the museum offers an intimate look into the life and mind of this artistic genius. See his masterpieces, such as Sunflowers, Almond Blossom, and self-portraits. Don’t miss the museum shop; you will find beautiful souvenirs and gifts to take back home. We will also visit the Anne Frank House. Lunch is at your leisure today (we have some great recommendations!). We will return to The Hague in the late evening for a good night’s rest. B | D (cruise)

Keukenhof - Tulips, Tulips, Tulips!

One of the biggest highlights of our journey is about to happen! After breakfast,

we will take a short drive to Keukenhof. People from all over the world come to enjoy the stunning 32-hectare Keukenhof Tulip Garden and explore the tulip fields. We will have a full day to admire the gardens and the more than seven million bulbs planted to create this floral extravaganza. But the park offers more than just a backdrop for its seven million spring-flowering bulbs; it is also a beautiful venue for sculptures and other works of art that add an extra dimension to the park. Keukenhof is collaborating with 25 artists. The combination of a blooming park and visual art is remarkable. Spend as much time as you wish exploring the Organic Garden, the Tropical Beach Garden, the Pink Tea Garden, the Graffiti Garden, and the Red Romance Garden. There are plenty of restaurants where you can enjoy lunch. You will also find a gift shop with lovely souvenirs to bring back home. Should you decide to purchase bulbs, ensure they are certified and approved by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). We will return to The Hague in the late afternoon. We will have fun at our farewell dinner, toasting to a great group and a beautiful journey through Belgium and the Netherlands. B | D
