Traveling to Tanzania

Your inspiring journey begins as we board our overnight flight to Kilimanjaro. Settle in, enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service, and let the excitement build as you embark on your dream adventure.

November 10, 2026 - Tuesday

Kilimanjaro - Arusha

Upon arrival in Kilimanjaro, we meet our English-speaking tour director who will accompany us throughout the journey. We begin with a private, expert-led introduction to Tanzania during our 90-minute drive to Arusha. Arusha with its 620,000 inhabitants is often called the safari capital and an important diplomatic city (home to the East African Community and international institutions). Later in the afternoon, check into our hotel and unwind, before our welcome dinner is served. Meals during flight | D

November 11, 2026 - Wednesday

Arusha

After a relaxed breakfast, we are ready to head out to explore Arusha. Set beneath the shadow of Mount Meru, Arusha is a graceful introduction to Tanzania's heart and soul. During our relaxed three-hour guided tour, you'll experience the city's rhythm through its stories, gardens, and welcoming people. Enjoy a visit to a local market, where colorful fabrics, tropical fruits, and warm smiles create a vivid sense of daily life. Pause in quiet green spaces to admire Mount Meru's views, and learn how Arusha became the meeting point of explorers, traders, and modern East Africa. This gentle exploration blends history, nature, and culture—perfectly paced and deeply enriching. We'll then savor a local lunch, before returning to the hotel for a leisurely afternoon and dinner. November 12, 2026 - Thursday

Women's Traditions & Local Life

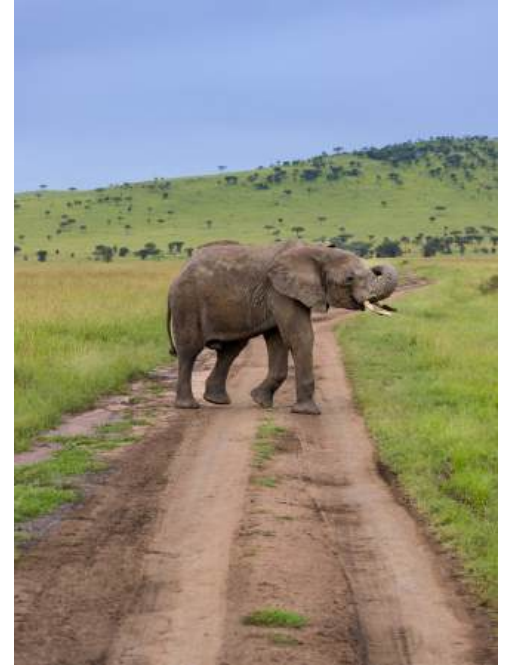
This morning, a short drive takes us to the Sakina area, where we are warmly welcomed by local women at Mama's locations. Here, you'll take part in daily activities such as soap making, tailoring clothing, decorating Maasai shukas with colorful beads, and crafting beaded bracelets—a hands-on glimpse into creativity and community. We then continue to Mulala village to visit a women-run cheese factory, learning how traditional skills support families and livelihoods. A local lunch is enjoyed along the way, offering authentic flavors of the region. The day concludes back at the hotel, where dinner is served in the evening, leaving you inspired by the strength and artistry of Tanzanian women. B | L | D

November 13, 2026 - Friday

Tarangire National Park — Land of Giants

Located in northern Tanzania, Tarangire National Park is celebrated for its plentiful elephant herds and striking ancient baobab trees that punctuate the vast savanna. Spanning approximately 1,100 square miles, the park is shaped by the Tarangire River, its vital lifeline and the only permanent water source during the dry season. This river draws impressive gatherings of elephant, wildebeest, zebra, and buffalo, along with predators such as lions, leopards, and cheetahs. Enjoy scenic game drives through a varied landscape of acacia woodlands, open plains, seasonal swamps, and vivid red termite mounds, while expert guides help spot wildlife and interpret the ecosystem. Tarangire is also a delight for bird lovers, with over 550 species, including the colorful Ashy Starling. Lunch is included, and after a rewarding day in the park, dinner is served at the hotel, allowing time

to relax and reflect on an unforgettable safari experience. B | L | D

November 14, 2026 - Saturday

Serengeti National Park

After breakfast, we depart at 7:00 AM for Serengeti National Park, Tanzania's oldest park and one of the most complex ecosystems on Earth. Largely unchanged for centuries, the Serengeti offers an extraordinary sense of timelessness, where vast plains support an abundance of wildlife. The Seronera Valley is a prime area for spotting predators, including lions, leopards, cheetahs, and hyenas, while elephants, giraffes, zebras, and wildebeest are commonly seen throughout the day. We will enjoy game drives across the central Serengeti, guided by expert knowledge of this remarkable landscape. In the late afternoon, we transfer to our lodge for dinner and overnight, surrounded by the sounds of the African wilderness. Close your eyes... shhh, listen! B | L | D

November 15, 2026 - Sunday

Serengeti National Park

Today unfolds at an unhurried pace with a full day of exploration in the Serengeti. As the light shifts across endless grasslands, wildlife activity changes from hour to hour, revealing quiet, intimate moments to observe and cherish. You may encounter elephants, giraffes, zebras, wildebeest, and, with luck, lions, cheetahs, or leopards resting or moving through the plains. Between game drives, there is time to pause, breathe deeply, and simply take it all in. These protected national parks offer a once-in-a-lifetime experience, touching something timeless and deeply personal, long remembered after the journey ends. As evening light softens the landscape, the Serengeti leaves its mark on the heart. Dinner is served at our beautiful lodge. B | L | D

Serengeti Balloon Safari



November 16, 2026 - Monday

Safari from Above & Time to Unwind
At dawn, experience the magic of a hot-air balloon safari, drifting silently above the Serengeti as the rising sun reveals wildlife moving across the plains below. After this unforgettable morning, return to your luxurious lodge to enjoy a day dedicated to comfort and renewal. Spend time reading, relaxing, or indulging in spa treatments, surrounded by nature and quiet elegance. Lunch and dinner are served at the lodge, allowing you to savor both fine cuisine and peaceful moments. A perfect balance of wonder, rest, and reflection in the heart of the Serengeti. B | L | D

November 17, 2026 - Tuesday

Ngorongoro Crater
After breakfast, we depart for the Ngorongoro Crater (also referred to as Nature's Grand Amphitheater), a scenic drive of about three hours to the entrance gate. After descending into the crater, we'll explore this extraordinary natural wonder, measuring over 12 miles wide and nearly 2,000 feet deep. The crater floor is home to a remarkable concentration of wildlife, including the Big Five—buffalo, black rhino, elephant, lion, and leopard—as well as cheetahs, zebras, hippos, hyenas, serval cats, and wildebeest. Enjoy game drives across this unique landscape, with a picnic lunch at a designated site. In the late afternoon, we continue to Karatu for dinner and overnight, reflecting on a truly unforgettable day. B | L | D

November 18, 2026 - Wednesday

Lake Eyasi — Cultures of the Rift Valley
Today's journey leads to Lake Eyasi, a seasonal salt lake in the Great Rift Valley, set against arid plains, palm trees, and the dramatic backdrop of Oldeani Mountain. This region offers a rare opportunity for

cultural immersion, as it is home to the Hadzabe, one of Africa's last hunter-gatherer communities, and the Datoga, known for their pastoral traditions and skilled blacksmithing. Experience daily life through our guided visits, including time with the Hadzabe and a visit to a Datoga village, where traditional metalwork and craftsmanship are demonstrated. Birdlife is also abundant along the lakeshore, with species such as flamingos and pelicans often seen. In the late afternoon, we return to Arusha for dinner and overnight. B | L | D

November 19, 2026 - Thursday

Zanzibar Islands — The Spice Islands
After a hearty breakfast, we transfer to Arusha Airport for our flight to the Zanzibar Islands, a legendary archipelago off the coast of Tanzania in the Indian Ocean. For over a thousand years, Zanzibar was a vital crossroads of global trade, where African, Arab, Persian, Indian, and European cultures converged. Ancient sailing routes carried ivory, gold, and spices through its ports, shaping a rich cultural legacy still visible in the island's architecture, cuisine, and traditions. Fertile soils and a tropical climate made Zanzibar famous as the "Spice Islands," once the world's leading producer of cloves, along with cinnamon, nutmeg, vanilla, and pepper (during our spice tour tomorrow, we will learn even more). After a 1½-hour flight, arrive in Zanzibar and meet our local tour director for an approximately one-hour transfer to Meliá Zanzibar, a beachfront resort on the island's northeast coast. Here, we will enjoy three all-inclusive nights, the perfect setting to unwind and reflect on the unforgettable safari days, surrounded by private white-sand beaches and turquoise waters, multiple infinity pools, a luxury spa, diverse restaurants and bars, water sports, and lush tropical gardens for relaxation and exploration. November 20, 2026 - Friday

Spice Tour
This morning, after a delightful breakfast, we will enjoy a three-hour guided spice tour to Kizimbani, one of Zanzibar's most famous spice-growing regions. Wander through lush plantations where spices and fruits grow exactly as they have for centuries. You'll have the chance to pick, smell, and taste fresh cloves, lemongrass, star fruit, tangerines, young mangoes, and the colorful "lipstick tree"—a sensory experience far beyond anything found on a supermarket shelf. Along the way, discover where Zanzibar's spice legacy began and browse the best local selection of handmade oils and perfumes. In the afternoon, return to our beautiful resort with time to relax, reflect, and enjoy the gentle rhythm of island life. All-Inclusive meals and drinks.

November 21, 2026 - Saturday

Zanzibar — A Perfect Farewell
Your final day in Zanzibar is yours to enjoy at your own pace. Group airfare comes with **seat assignments 30 days prior to departure**. We cannot confirm precise seat numbers earlier than 30 days prior to your departure and therefore cannot guarantee the availability of specific seating on the aircraft. We do our best to honor your preferences (window, aisle seat).

Premium seating upgrades are not available when traveling on a group air contract. If you have frequent flyer miles (SkyMiles), please note those cannot be used to upgrade to Delta Comfort Plus but only be used for upgrades to business or first class when traveling on a group air contract. Contact us if you have any questions about this and kindly note that certain exceptions may exist.
