Traveling to Paris, France

Our wonderful and life-inspiring journey begins as we take an overnight flight to Paris. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you start your dream vacation.

April 20, 2027 - Tuesday

Welcome to France!

Our tour guide and driver will meet us at the airport, and then we head toward the Normandy region. On our way, we stop to visit Claude Monet's House and Gardens in Giverny. Art lovers will instantly recognize scenes immortalized in Monet's most cherished paintings, such as water lilies, Japanese bridges, and graceful willow trees. Explore his renowned gardens and home, where he lived for over four decades. In the late afternoon, we arrive at our hotel in Bayeux in time for dinner. If you are still awake, take a stroll along the Aure River or walk the cobbled streets of the medieval town with its stone and timber-framed houses. Bayeux was the first French city liberated thanks to the D-Day landings. Then, off to a well-deserved night's rest.. L (boxed) | D

April 21, 2027 - Wednesday

D-Day Beaches

After breakfast, we begin our day at Utah Beach, where the Higgins Boat Memorial recalls the story of the Allied landings and the reasons for success here. We continue to the Church of Sainte-Mère-Église, where Private John Steele's parachute famously caught on the tower, leaving him dangling from its side. After free time for lunch, our journey takes us to Pointe du Hoc, where U.S. Army Rangers bravely scaled a 100-foot cliff

under fire to disable German artillery, leaving behind a lunar-like landscape of craters and bunkers. Later, we visit Omaha Beach, codename for one of the five Allied landing sectors, before pausing at the American Cemetery of Colleville-sur-Mer, the first U.S. cemetery on European soil during WWII. The evening is yours to relax and enjoy Bayeux. B

April 22, 2027 - Thursday

D-Day Beaches

Today, we will continue our exploration of the D-Day Beaches, including Gold Beach, Juno Beach, and Arromanches-Bains to discover the Mulberry Harbors - considered one of the greatest engineering feats of WWII - the temporary mobile harbors for unloading troops, vehicles, and supplies. Lunch is served at a local bistro, before we drive to our favorite Calvados producer in the area. Calvados is a special brandy made from crisp and sweet Normandy apples; a perfect ending to our day. Our Calvados tasting is accompanied by delicious local cheeses. B | L | T

April 23, 2027 - Friday

Honfleur - Painting Class

Honfleur, located where the Seine river meets the English Channel, is considered the birthplace of Impressionism. The Vieux-Bassin (old harbor), lined with 16th- to 18th-century townhouses, has inspired notable painters such as Eugène Boudin (born in Honfleur), Claude Monet, Gustave Courbet, and Johan Barthold Jongkind. They congregated here, forming the École de Honfleur (School of Honfleur), which predated the formal Impressionist movement. As a cradle of Impressionism, Honfleur is filled with

art galleries and workshops, and you are invited to reveal your talent in the heart of a place steeped in history, the Ferme Saint Siméon, nestling in the hills above Honfleur, and also the location for our delicious lunch. Take a seat in front of the landscapes that inspired the Impressionists and let the artists guide you as you learn the techniques of composition, color and light. A timeless opportunity to experience art in the open air. We will return to Bayeux in the late afternoon for an evening at leisure. B | L | D

April 24, 2027 - Saturday

Mont Sainte-Michel - Saint Malo

After a nourishing breakfast, we continue through Normandy's gentle countryside toward Mont Saint-Michel, a striking tidal island and UNESCO World Heritage Site, celebrated for its abbey rising proudly at the summit. Encircled by a bay with Europe's highest tides (sometimes reaching 50 feet), it offers a charming medieval village with cobbled lanes and remains an important pilgrimage destination with remarkable religious and cultural history, often called the "Wonder of the West." Enjoy the renowned fluffy omelets of Mont Saint-Michel before exploring the thousand-year-old Benedictine abbey, said in legend to be inspired by Archangel Michael. We conclude in Saint Malo, a fortified seaport famed for seafaring tradition and pirate tales. Dinner is included this evening, relax, and unwind. B | L | D

April 25, 2027 - Sunday

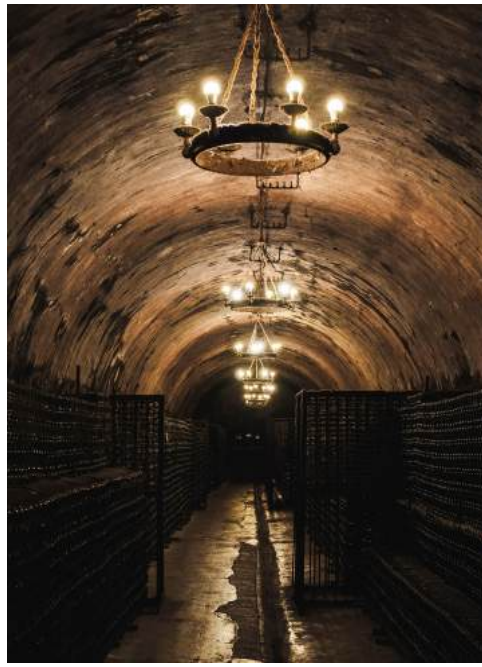
Loire Valley – Villandry – Blois

After breakfast, we journey into the enchanting Loire Valley, often called the "Garden of France," celebrated for its

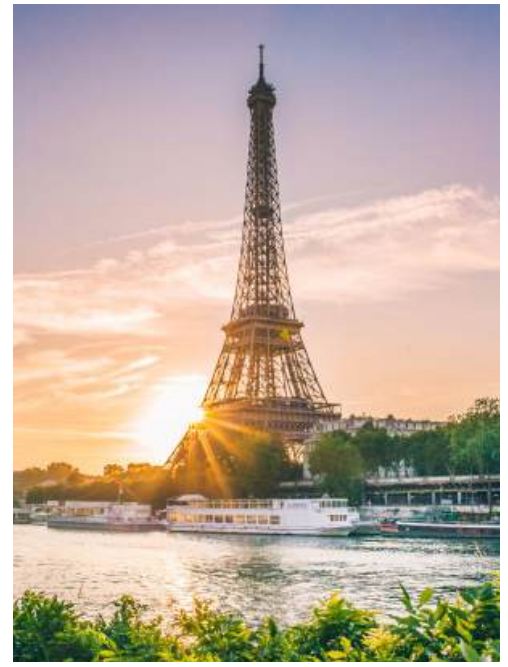

grand châteaux and timeless landscapes. Our stop is at Château de Villandry, the last great Renaissance castle built in the Loire, renowned for its splendid terraced gardens. Once the passion project of a wealthy nobleman and his wife, these gardens today unfold like a tapestry of history, where symbolic patterns of love, music, and spirituality are traced in flowers and greenery. After enjoying a delightful lunch and guided visit of both the château and its celebrated gardens, we continue to Blois, a historic town overlooking the Loire River. Favored by French kings and filled with stories of royal intrigue, Blois invites you to wander its charming streets. Following check-in, the evening is yours to enjoy at leisure. Blois is our base for two nights. B | L

April 26, 2027 - Monday

Chenonceau – Amboise

This morning, we set out to discover Château de Chenonceau, the elegant “Ladies’ Castle” gracefully spanning the River Cher. Admired for its graceful arches, lavishly decorated rooms, and fascinating stories of queens and noblewomen who shaped its destiny, Chenonceau remains one of France’s most romantic landmarks. We continue to the charming village of Cloiseaux, where we enjoy lunch. Our journey then brings us to Château Royal d’Amboise, once home to French kings and the final resting place of Leonardo da Vinci. Later, we savor a guided wine tasting at Cave Ambacia, where regional vintages reveal the Loire Valley’s centuries-old winemaking traditions. Celebrated wines and timeless scenery make for a memorable day. We return to Blois for a relaxing evening. B | L

April 27, 2027 - Tuesday

Chartres - Versailles - Paris

After an early breakfast, we begin our journey toward Paris with a stop in Chartres for a visit to its magnificent cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famed for its soaring spires and breathtaking stained glass windows dating back to the 12th and 13th centuries. Time for a quick bite before we continue to Versailles. Step into the grandeur of the Sun King’s court, where opulent salons, glittering chandeliers, and the famed Hall of Mirrors recall the splendor of Louis XIV and Marie Antoinette*. By early evening, we arrive in Paris and check in at our hotel. The evening is free for you to relax or begin exploring the City of Light at your own pace. B

April 28, 2027 - Wednesday

Paris

This morning, we set out to explore the treasures of Paris, beginning with the world-renowned Louvre Museum (visit), home to masterpieces spanning centuries of art, including the Mona Lisa and the graceful Venus de Milo. We then drive along the famous Champs-Élysées, lined with elegant cafés, luxury boutiques, and historic landmarks, before continuing to Montmartre for lunch in the charming artists’ quarter beneath the white domes of Sacré-Cœur. In the afternoon, we admire the grandeur of the Opéra Garnier (visit) and pause by the Gothic splendor of Notre-Dame Cathedral (photo stop). For those who wish, an optional perfume-making workshop offers a uniquely Parisian and wonderfully memorable experience. The evening is free. B | L

April 29, 2027 - Thursday

Reims

After breakfast, we depart Paris for a full-day excursion to the Champagne region, where rolling vineyards and elegant cellars tell the story of France’s most celebrated sparkling wine. In Reims, the historic capital of Champagne, we admire the magnificent Gothic cathedral where French kings were crowned, before enjoying a guided visit of the prestigious Pommery Champagne House, discovering vast underground chalk caves and learning the secrets of traditional production. After a delightful lunch, we continue to Hautvillers, the village of Dom Pérignon, the monk remembered as father of Champagne. Our journey then brings us to Épernay for a guided visit and tasting at the renowned Mercier Champagne House, the last tasting of the day; cheers to us! Return to Paris. B | L | T

April 30, 2027 - Friday

Paris (French Labor Day)

The day is free to enjoy Paris at your own rhythm, with your guide offering inspiring suggestions. In the evening, we gather for a farewell dinner cruise on the Seine, savoring fine cuisine as illuminated landmarks drift by — a sparkling finale to our unforgettable French adventure. B | D
