April 11, 2027 - Sunday

Tokyo

We continue to elegant Omotesando, known for stylish architecture, boutiques, and cafés, before returning to the excitement of Shibuya Crossing. We gather for dinner at our hotel. April 14, 2027 - Wednesday

Mount Fuji & Hakone

Today we journey into Japan's scenic countryside. Weather permitting, we visit Mount Fuji's 5th Station, where Japan's most iconic mountain rises in quiet majesty. We continue to Hakone for a peaceful cruise on Lake Ashi, followed by the Hakone Ropeway, offering sweeping views of volcanic valleys and surrounding mountains. Tonight, enjoy a memorable stay in the Mount Fuji area, with dinner and the relaxing comfort of a Japanese-style hotel. You will also have the opportunity to experience one of Japan's most cherished traditions: the onsen. These natural hot spring baths have been part of Japanese culture for centuries and are deeply connected to relaxation, wellness, and quiet reflection. April 15, 2027 - Thursday

Bullet Train to Kyoto & Bamboo Forest

This morning we travel to Odawara Station and board Japan's famous bullet train to Kyoto. Smooth, quiet, and remarkably fast, the Shinkansen is an experience in itself and a wonderful example of Japan's precision and innovation. Watching the countryside glide past the window is both relaxing and unforgettable. Upon arrival in Kyoto, we discover enchanting Arashiyama and its world-famous Bamboo Forest. Walking beneath the towering emerald-green stalks feels

almost dreamlike as sunlight filters softly through the swaying bamboo overhead. The gentle rustling sound created by the wind moving through the grove is considered so unique and soothing that Japan's Ministry of the Environment has named it one of the country's "100 Soundscapes of Japan." Long associated with tranquility and meditation, bamboo also symbolizes strength and resilience in Japanese culture. Later, we participate in a traditional calligraphy workshop, discovering the beauty and mindfulness behind this centuries-old art form. With each graceful brushstroke, we gain a deeper appreciation for the patience, balance, and quiet beauty woven throughout Japanese culture. B | D

April 16, 2027 - Friday

Kyoto: Kimono, Tea & Gion

Today invites us into the timeless elegance of traditional Japan. We begin with a special kimono experience, dressing in beautifully crafted garments that have symbolized grace, artistry, and cultural identity for centuries. Traditionally worn for celebrations and important occasions, kimonos are admired for their intricate fabrics, seasonal patterns, and careful craftsmanship. Even the way a kimono is folded and tied reflects centuries of tradition and refinement. Next, we experience a traditional Japanese tea ceremony, one of the country's most treasured cultural rituals. Rooted in Zen philosophy, the ceremony is far more than simply preparing tea—it is an art form centered on harmony, respect, tranquility, and mindfulness. Every movement is thoughtful and precise, inviting us to slow down and appreciate the beauty of the present moment. We then visit the magnificent Kiyomizu Temple, dramatically perched on a hillside overlooking Kyoto. Founded in 778, the temple's wooden terrace offers sweeping

views across the city and surrounding mountains. Later, we stroll through Kyoto's famous Gion district lined with traditional wooden teahouses and lantern-lit alleyways. Gion is best known as Kyoto's historic geisha district. Geisha—highly trained female entertainers skilled in classical music, dance, conversation, and hospitality—have long been an elegant part of Japanese cultural life. With a little luck, we may glimpse a geisha or maiko (apprentice geisha) gracefully making her way to an evening engagement. Dinner is enjoyed at our hotel. B | T | D

April 17, 2027 - Saturday

Nara & Fushimi Inari

Today we travel to Nara, Japan's first permanent capital. In Nara Park, friendly deer roam freely and are considered sacred messengers in the Shinto religion. We visit Todaiji Temple, home to the Great Buddha—one of the largest bronze Buddha statues in the world—before continuing to Kasuga Taisha Shrine, where thousands of lanterns line peaceful forest pathways. Later, we return toward Kyoto to visit the iconic Fushimi Inari Shrine, one of Japan's most photographed and spiritually significant sites. Dedicated to Inari, the Shinto god of rice, prosperity, and business success, the shrine is famous for its endless pathways of vibrant vermilion torii gates winding through the wooded hillside. Fun fact: many of these gates have been donated by individuals and companies over the years, with each donor's name inscribed on the back. Walking beneath the seemingly endless tunnels of red is both peaceful and unforgettable. Dinner is served at our hotel. B | D

April 18, 2027 - Sunday

April 19, 2027 - Monday

Kyoto to Osaka

Today we continue to Osaka, Japan's lively culinary and entertainment capital. While Kyoto is often considered the cultural heart of Japan, Osaka is affectionately known as "Japan's Kitchen," where locals embrace the philosophy of *kuidaore*—"eat until you drop." We begin with a visit to the striking Umeda Sky Building with sweeping panoramic views. Next, we explore magnificent Osaka Castle, originally built in the 16th century by the powerful samurai warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi, who played a major role in unifying Japan. Later, we discover the lively districts of Dotonbori and Shinsaibashi, where giant neon signs, colorful billboards, and endless restaurants create an atmosphere bursting with excitement. Along the canals and busy streets, tempting aromas drift from food stalls serving the city's famous street-food specialties. You will love Osaka's joyful energy, hospitality, and love of life. April 20, 2027 - Tuesday

Hiroshima & Miyajima

We board the bullet train for a meaningful day in Hiroshima. Our visit begins on Miyajima Island at Itsukushima Shrine, famous for its "floating" red torii gate rising from the sea. We then enjoy an *okonomiyaki* lunch experience, tasting Hiroshima's beloved savory pancake. In
