February 13, 2027 - Saturday

Traveling to Quito, Ecuador

Our adventure begins as we board our flight to Ecuador, one of South America's most fascinating and biodiverse countries. February 14, 2027 - Sunday

Middle of the World

Today we venture north of Quito to stand at one of the most famous locations in South America—the Equator itself. Our day begins with a visit to an ancestral knowledge center, where we are welcomed by an indigenous family who will share traditions, beliefs, and customs that have shaped life in the Andes for centuries. We will learn about the Andean worldview and participate in a traditional cleansing ceremony, a meaningful cultural experience that offers insight into local spiritual practices and the enduring wisdom of Ecuador's indigenous communities. We continue to the fascinating Intiñan Museum, where interactive exhibits demonstrate the unique phenomena associated with the Equator. Here, we will learn about Ecuador's geography, indigenous cultures, and the scientific significance of this remarkable location. A day filled with discovery, culture, fascinating traditions, and a touch of equatorial magic. B | L

February 15, 2027 - Monday

Quito City Tour

Our day begins at El Panecillo, a hilltop viewpoint offering sweeping panoramic views across the city and surrounding valleys. From here, we descend into Quito's historic center, designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site and often referred to as the „Reliquary of the Americas“ for its extraordinary collection of churches, monasteries, plazas, and colonial architecture. We enjoy lunch at a traditional Fonda Quiteña, where local flavors and warm hospitality transport us back to another era. This afternoon, we explore the remarkable artistic traditions of the Quito School of Art. Influenced by both European and Indigenous techniques, these masterworks are celebrated for their intricate detail, lifelike carvings, and distinctive Andean character. We also visit the magnificent Church of La Compañía, famous for its dazzling interior adorned with gold leaf, before strolling through Independence Square, the historic and political heart of Ecuador. February 16, 2027 - Tuesday

Zuleta Embroidery, Roses & San Clemente Community

We journey north into the Andean highlands, where breathtaking mountain scenery and authentic cultural encounters await. Our day begins with a visit to one of Ecuador's renowned rose plantations. Thanks to rich volcanic soil, high altitude, and year-round equatorial sunshine, Ecuadorian roses are prized around the world for their vibrant colors, exceptional beauty, and remarkably long stems. We continue to the charming village of Zuleta, renowned throughout Ecuador for its exquisite hand embroidery. During our visit, we meet talented artisans and gain insight into a craft that continues to support families and

strengthen the community. A special highlight today is a traditional pamba mesa lunch, a communal meal that celebrates friendship, sharing, gratitude, and community. This afternoon we continue to San Clemente. Here we are welcomed by local residents and learn about their customs, traditions, and way of life. Tonight, we settle into our beautiful hacienda and enjoy a relaxing evening in the heart of the Ecuadorian highlands. B | L

February 17, 2027 - Wednesday

Otavalo Market & Condor Park

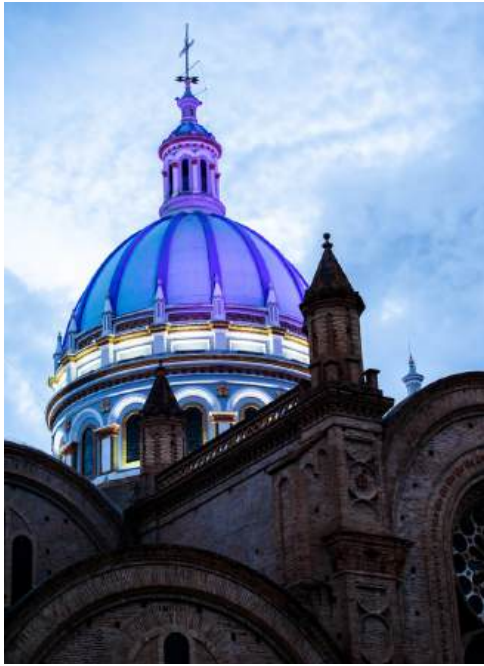
After a leisurely breakfast, we visit one of the most famous indigenous markets in South America. The colorful Otavalo Market has attracted traders, artisans, and visitors for centuries. Stroll among stalls overflowing with handwoven textiles, alpaca garments, jewelry, artwork, leather goods, and beautifully crafted souvenirs. Lunch is enjoyed against the spectacular backdrop of Imbabura Volcano. Later, we visit Condor Park, a rescue and conservation center dedicated to protecting Ecuador's magnificent birds of prey. Here we learn about the important work being done to rehabilitate birds rescued from illegal captivity and unsuitable environments. The majestic Andean Condor, one of the largest flying birds in the world and a powerful symbol of the Andes, is among the remarkable species we may encounter. February 18, 2027 - Thursday

Cuenca City Tour & Culinary Experience

This morning we take a short flight south to Cuenca, often considered Ecuador's most beautiful city. Nestled among rolling mountains and crossed by four rivers,

Our day begins with a visit to a traditional workshop where the famous Panama Hat is handcrafted. Despite its name, this iconic hat originated in Ecuador, and we will learn about the painstaking artistry involved in transforming delicate toquilla straw into a masterpiece of craftsmanship. We continue with a guided exploration of Cuenca's UNESCO-listed historic center. We also visit a ceramics studio, where local artisans continue techniques passed down through generations. Tonight, we gather for an exceptional culinary experience at one of Ecuador's celebrated restaurants. Creative cuisine and warm hospitality combine to create a memorable evening. B | L | D

Ingapirca & Chordeleg
Today we step back in time as we travel through the beautiful Andean countryside to Ingapirca, Ecuador's most important archaeological site and the largest known Incan ruins in the country. Ingapirca offers a fascinating glimpse into the civilizations that once flourished here. We learn about the history, engineering achievements, and spiritual significance of the site, including the remarkable Temple of the Sun, an elliptical structure carefully aligned with celestial events and built using precisely fitted stones. After lunch, we continue to the charming artisan town of Chordeleg, famous for its exquisite silver and gold jewelry. Time is yours to browse the workshops, galleries, and boutiques. Today offers a wonderful blend of culture, craftsmanship, and discovery. B | L

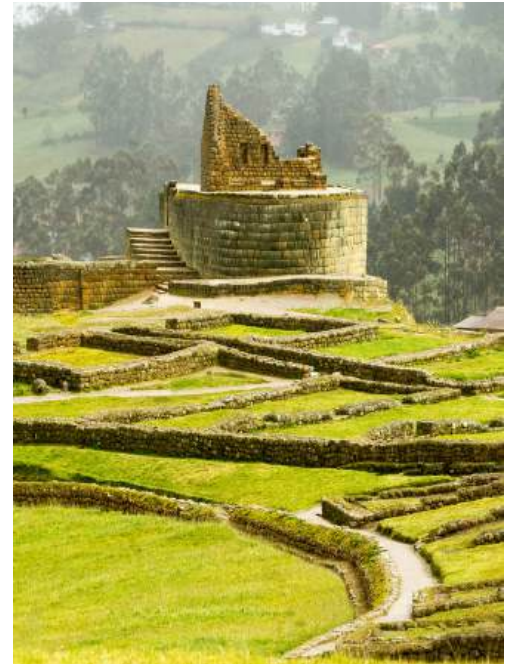
February 21, 2027 - Sunday

Papallacta Hot Springs

Lunch is served at the resort before we explore the scenic Island Trail, where native plants, colorful birdlife, and beautiful landscapes provide wonderful opportunities for photography and nature appreciation. To the Galápagos Islands

Floreana Island

Established by whalers in the eighteenth century, a simple wooden barrel served as an unofficial mailbox for sailors far from home. The tradition continues today, and visitors often leave postcards while hand-delivering mail destined for their own communities. We continue to Baroness Viewing Point, where breathtaking scenery and one of the Galápagos' most enduring mysteries await. Stories of an eccentric baroness, her companions, and a series of unexplained disappearances have intrigued visitors for generations. This afternoon we visit Cormorant Point, home to a beautiful flamingo lagoon and two dramatically different beaches. Keep watch for flamingos, sea birds, and marine life as we explore this extraordinary landscape. B | L | D

February 24, 2027 - Wednesday

Santa Fé Island & Santa Cruz Wake to another day of extraordinary discoveries in the Galápagos. This morning we visit Santa Fé Island, known for its crystal-clear waters, giant prickly pear cacti, and unique wildlife found nowhere else on Earth. Walking trails lead through cactus forests and along scenic viewpoints where we may spot land iguanas, sea lions, and numerous bird species. This afternoon we arrive on Santa Cruz Island and visit the Fausto Llerena Giant Tortoise Breeding Center. Here we meet one of the Galápagos' most iconic residents—the giant tortoise. From tiny hatchlings to impressive adults weighing hundreds of pounds, we learn about ongoing conservation efforts that have helped protect these remarkable creatures for future generations. Seeing these gentle giants up close is an unforgettable highlight of any visit to the Galápagos. B | L | D

February 25, 2027 - Thursday

San Cristóbal Island –
Return to Mainland Ecuador
Our final morning in the Galápagos begins on San Cristóbal Island. We visit the Gianni Arismendi Interpretation Center, where engaging exhibits tell the fascinating story of the archipelago. Learn about the volcanic origins of the islands, the unique wildlife that evolved in isolation, and the conservation efforts that continue to protect this extraordinary ecosystem. As we reflect on the remarkable wildlife encounters, breathtaking landscapes, and unforgettable experiences of the past several days, we gain an even deeper appreciation for this natural wonder of the world. Later, we transfer to San Cristóbal Airport for our flight back to mainland Ecuador.

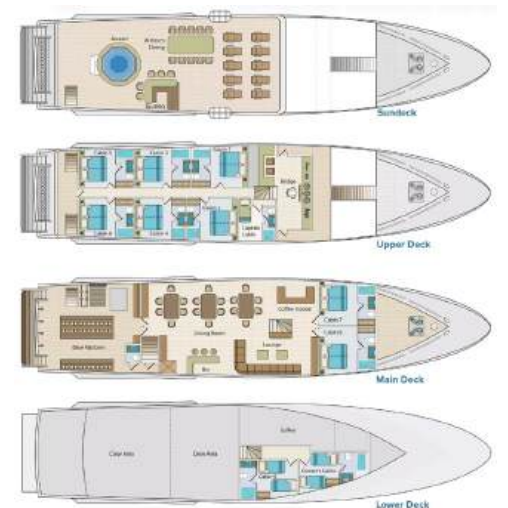
Please Note:

Several destinations on this tour are located in the Ecuadorian highlands. While most travelers adjust comfortably, some may notice the effects of higher elevations during the first few days. To help with acclimatization, our journey begins with several nights in the Quito region, allowing time to settle in and adjust at a relaxed pace. We recommend staying well hydrated and consulting your physician if you have concerns about traveling at altitude.

Our Galápagos cruise is aboard the recently renovated Calipso Yacht, an intimate vessel accommodating just 16 guests in 10 comfortable cabins. All cabins feature private bathrooms, air-conditioning, panoramic windows, and modern amenities. Onboard facilities include inviting lounges, a dining room, bar, spacious sun deck, and Jacuzzi. Experienced naturalist guides lead all excursions, and snorkeling equipment and wetsuits are included.

February 26, 2027 - Friday

Quito – Coca – Napo River

We transfer to Quito Airport and board our short flight to Coca, the gateway to the Ecuadorian Amazon. Upon arrival, our adventure begins immediately as we board a motorized canoe and journey downriver, surrounded by the sights and sounds of the rainforest. Soon we arrive at our beautiful river vessel and settle into our cabins. After lunch, our expert naturalist guides introduce us to the fascinating ecosystems, wildlife, and cultures of the Amazon. Take time to explore the ship's observation deck, comfortable lounges, and inviting public spaces while the rainforest scenery unfolds around us. After dinner, those who wish may join an optional nighttime rainforest walk. As

darkness falls, the forest comes alive with remarkable sounds, scents, and activity. This thrilling introduction to the Amazon offers an entirely different perspective on life in the jungle and is often considered one of the highlights of the journey. B | L | D

February 27, 2027 - Saturday

Pañacocha Biological Corridor

Today we continue deeper into the rainforest as we travel to the Pañayacu River Delta and beautiful Pañacocha Lake, whose name means „Piranha Lake“ in the Kichwa language. This pristine blackwater ecosystem is surrounded by protected rainforest and supports an astonishing diversity of wildlife. Our naturalist guides lead us on explorations by canoe and on foot as we search for monkeys, exotic birds, caimans, and other fascinating creatures that inhabit this remarkable environment. Lunch is enjoyed Amazon-style at a riverside campsite surrounded by nature. Later, there is an opportunity to kayak through the calm waters or, for the adventurous, enjoy a refreshing swim in the lake. Don't worry—the experience is far less intimidating than the name suggests! Back onboard, we gather to learn more about the region through engaging presentations and stories shared by our expert staff. B | L | D

February 28, 2027 - Sunday

Parrot Clay Licks & Amazonian Communities

This morning we witness one of the Amazon's most spectacular natural events. There will also be time to browse locally made handicrafts and souvenirs, supporting the community and its ongoing cultural preservation efforts.
